THE COST OF GAS

As a regulated utility, New Mexico Gas Company does not make a profit on the natural gas we purchase on behalf of our customers, but passes the cost of natural gas from suppliers directly on to you. The cost of gas is a line item on your bill. The final January cost of gas can be found on this month's bill. Last month's cost of gas was \$0.3535 and last January's cost of gas was \$0.4339. The estimated average home gas use for January is 124 therms, and the estimated average residential gas bill for January is \$90.

We do not make a profit on the natural gas we purchase on behalf of our customers.
